Business Administration – Royal Cornwall

How did you get started in your career?

My mum worked in the NHS and one day told me about an apprenticeship in Administration being advertised. I applied, had an interview and then was lucky enough to get employed.

Can you outline a typical work day?

I get in for 8am, check my emails to see if I need to prioritise anything first. I then spend the rest of my day supporting my Team.

What do you enjoy most about your job?

I enjoy working with my team as it's full of good personalities and good 'banter'. Everyone is fully supportive and makes the day pass that little bit easier and my job more enjoyable. Nobody likes a quiet and tense atmosphere.

What skills are important for anyone wishing to start in your profession?

I only just managed to get five C's in my GCSE's, and felt like I had no particular skills. The only bit of skill I had was that I wasn't too bad with a computer, but they still saw potential in me and gave me an opportunity.

Whilst the Apprentice will be learning all sorts of new skills, the Trust will also be learning something new from the Apprentice, as they will always be bringing in new ideas to help organisations to develop.
