Introduction

Avanti is one of the UK's leading satellite operators that provide high speed data communication services across the UK, Europe, Middle East and Africa. Its first satellite Hylas 1 launched in 2009, with a total of three satellites placed in orbit as of August 2018. Their Ka-Band payload services are utilised by ISPs, Governments, and Mobile Network Operators.



How did you get started in your career?

With a very memorable interview at Goonhilly, featuring some impromptu role-play for an ice-cream delivery company! Following this I was given the opportunity to join the company's Technical Support team. After two years working with different partners, their engineers, and other departments within the company I was accepted into the Satellite Operations Control team as a Satellite Controller.

Can you outline a typical work day?

We provide oversight to the fleet of three satellites (Hylas 1, 2 and 4) and work as part of a larger team that look after the systems both on the ground and on the spacecraft, whilst ensuring each remain in their respective geosynchronous orbits.

What do you enjoy most about your job?
